

Principal's Letter

Dear Meridian Park Families,

We are a few weeks away from summer and Meridian Park is still in full swing! Our learning environment is filled with many activities such as field trips, assemblies, classroom presentations, plays, projects and end-of-the-year assessments. There is a buzz all around as the students celebrate the amazing academic progress they have made this year. This past Friday, our students (and many volunteers!) also enjoyed Field Day. What a fun day!

As June goes on, the staff and I are also in the midst of planning for the next school year. Together, we're finessing our professional learning community work, working on our master schedule, digging deeper into our RtI (response to intervention) work and continuing with more professional development in all academic areas. We are moving towards reading blocks in the primary grades and are excited about some concrete ways to increase reading achievement for our students. Our K-6 teachers will also learn a new science curriculum and our 6th grade teachers will learn a new math curriculum that aligns with our K-5 math program.

We have also begun our staffing process for next year and have placed classroom teachers into their teaching assignments. This process is still tentative given enrollment numbers increasing (or decreasing), so teaching assignments can (and may) change over the summer. As you may notice, Meridian Park will decrease in size for the coming school year. As of now, we will only have two general education K classrooms (a half day and an all day) due to the fact that our Developmental Kindergarten program is ending. At this point, we plan to have two first-grade classrooms, one second- grade classroom, one 2/3 classroom, two third-grade classrooms, two fourth-grade classrooms, two fifth-grade classrooms and two sixth-grade classrooms. For our Highly Capable program, we will have one classroom at each grade level from second grade through sixth grade. If enrollment numbers change, we will make adjustments in August and September.

This month, our teachers have also been working on the placement process for assigning students to classrooms for next year. Our teachers work very hard to build classrooms that are well-balanced in a variety of ways. Since we don't always know the exact numbers of students in June, we often make some readjustments in the fall. This might mean changes for teacher's teaching assignments as well as classroom placements for students. Sometimes changes occur even after school begins, due to changes in enrollment, staffing, and class-balance. Rest assured that you will receive the most up-to-date information about your child's classroom placement within the first week of September.

On a final note, as I am sure you are aware, I have the bittersweet position of informing you that there are some staff changes coming to our Meridian Park community. Soon, we will say goodbye to some beloved members of our school. It is a challenging time for all of us, including staff, students, and families as we face these changes. Our Early Childhood school psychologist, Barbara Whitson, is retiring from our school district. We will also say goodbye to five wonderful teachers: Kristin Hazleton, Carlotta Han, Kelsey Graves, Elise Clarke, and Trilby Cohen, and our three student interns, Allan Rand, Jennifer Moon, and Nicole Mauge. Additionally, we will say goodbye to many of our support staff in the Developmental Kindergarten and ECE classrooms including Nancy Villano, Connie Graebner, Clare Wheaton, Bobbie Redford, Chrystel Matthews, Jill McManigal, Maryam Razaghzadeh, and Aidan Fortunati. It is with heartfelt gratitude that I say thank you (and sadly, goodbye) to these wonderful colleagues who have contributed to our school. I am grateful to each of them for their unique contributions to our school. This fall, you will learn of other changes to our staff as well as hearing about the new staff members who will fill positions at Meridian Park.

Lastly, thank YOU. Thank you for an incredible school year filled with so much great learning for all of us. I will enjoy some time off in July with my fantastic husband, Wyeth and our fun-filled daughters, Seneca and Sadie. They remind me every day of the importance of positive relationships and how much we learn from children. It will be great to reconnect with all of you in the fall. I wish you all a safe and restful summer with your family and friends. Be well.

New Certified Teacher Evaluation

After extensive review and discussion, the Shoreline Evaluation Committee adopted the Danielson Framework for our teacher evaluation system. A copy of that framework, arranged by Washington State's criteria for teacher evaluation, can be reviewed at the OSPI website at www.k12.wa.us. Also, please note that Senate Bill 5895 has been introduced and signed into law. This legislation modifies the initial four-tier evaluation system that was mandated when SB 6696 passed during the 2010 session. The new legislation has some immediate implications to our school district system. Here are some notable and relevant *changes* due to ESSB 5895:

The implementation schedule has been relaxed, requiring full implementation by 2016 (previously full implementation was required during the 2013-14 school years). Evaluative thresholds for probation have been defined by the state. Provisional employees, or those with five or fewer years of experience, must be placed on probation if they are deemed unsatisfactory (level 1). Teachers who are not provisional with more than five years of experience must be placed on probation if they are evaluated as unsatisfactory (level 1) for a single year or if they are evaluated as basic (level 2) for two years in a three-year period.

The state will establish a formula for determining summative evaluation scores or how the new system is "scored." This formula must be developed by December 1, 2012.

Student growth data must be a "substantial factor" in evaluating at least three of the eight criteria. Student growth is defined to be "the change in student achievement between two points in time." (Washington's state-based assessments do not currently satisfy this definition.)

Our district will participate in a pilot for the new system beginning in 2012-13. Stay tuned for more information about this as we begin on this new journey in Washington State.

Common Core

Have you been keeping up with the Common Core Standards? Here are a few facts that you might find interesting:

Washington State joined 46 other states in the endeavor to adopt the Common Core Standards. The Standards are not a Federal mandate, but rather a volunteer action by many states to work towards the same set of national standards that are clear, explicit, and rigorous for our students.

So far, the standards are in English, language arts, and math. There are some big shifts from Washington State's GLE's (Grade Level Expectations) and require new learning for our students and our staff. This year, teachers in the primary grades have already been learning about the standards at various district professional development opportunities.

For language arts, students will spend more time reading informational texts, both stories and non-fiction. There will be less

6th Grade Immunizations

Immunization requirements for incoming 6th graders are: Tdap: One dose for 6th grade if child is 11 years or older Varicella (Chicken Pox) vaccine: One dose at age 1 year or older, or parent-reported history of the chicken pox (need approximate month and year of disease in writing).

time spent reflecting on our own personal experiences in writing and more time spent drawing evidence from text, both literary and informational. There will be increased practice with complex texts and academic language. In math, there will be a big focus on increased coherence, thinking across grade levels, and linking major topics together. There will also be increased rigor in terms of helping students understand math concepts and apply them to real-world problems.

With such a big national shift, there will be some huge marketplace impacts for the United States in terms of keeping up with our international colleagues. In 2014-15, all public schools in Washington State will begin to assess their students using these common standards as a guide. We will no longer use the MSP (Measure for Student Progress) for math, reading and writing; instead, we will use the **SMARTER Balanced Assessment** system. Math Olympiad for Elementary and Middle Schools All the students in the Meridian Park Competition Math Club participate in the Elementary Division of the Mathematical Olympiad for Elementary and Middle Schools. MOEMS is a multinational contest, with a worldwide participation of more than eighty five thousand students during the November to March contest cycle. Division E of the MOEMS consists of five monthly contests from November through March and is open to any student in 6th grade or lower. Everyone in our club does the same contest regardless of grade.

Ardelle Ning, Grant Hugh, Julie Zhou and Spencer Lu achieved perfect scores (25 out of 25) and earned the Lenchner Medal. They are joined in the 2011-2012 Honor Roll by James Qiu, Michelle Wang and Nathaniel Poole who scored 24 out of 25 points (http://moems.org/newsletter.htm). Whooping Cough Vaccinations

King County pharmacies are now offering low-cost whooping cough vaccine for the uninsured and many community clinics also offer low-cost booster shots for clients. People without health insurance or who can't afford to pay for whooping cough (pertussis) vaccine are now able to get it for a low cost at two local pharmacy chains, made available with help from the AmeriCares patient assistance program. Local QFC and Bartell Drugs pharmacies offer low-cost adult whooping cough booster shots (known as Tdap vaccine). A full listing of pharmacy locations with low cost vaccines, as well as locations with vaccine at full cost for those with insurance, is available at www.kingcounty.gov/health/pertussis.
